
What are the differences between Center-Based Program Implemented in Alternative Venues (CBPAV) and the Home-Based ECCD Program?

The CBPAV is an emergency response plan of action to ensure the continuity of learning of 0- to 4-year-old children enrolled in Center-based Programs.





The Home-based ECCD
Program, is a long-term
alternative delivery mode
for Early Learning Programs,
especially in areas where the
Child Development Center is
inaccessible.

Status of Child Development Center

cDC is available, but temporarily inaccessible due to damage or closure brought by disasters and emergencies



CDC is not available or inaccessible

- in areas with no CDC
- in areas with unsafe path/ commute to CDC
- by children/parent with disorder/disability
- by IP groups/community residing in geographically isolated and disadvantaged areas
- in areas with congested CDC

Length of Implementation

Temporary/ Short-term

- Program runs in alternative venues (e.g., child's home or temporary learning spaces) while CDCs are still inaccessible
- Classes in CDCs resume after recovery from disaster/emergency; or repair and safety of CDC is ensured



Long-term
Program runs for an entire school year
